**What's In It For Me? : Transitioning Roles and Expectations for Security  
Managers and Providers**

**Sessions:**

Security managers today face a rapidly changing and evolving workplace. Not only do we need to keep abreast of developments in the day to day management of security service provision but we face a constant battle in dealing with corporate or customer expectations. As expectations change, so too do the linked roles and responsibilities we must take on, whether as a corporate security manager, a security consultant or a security services provider. And when it all boils down, are we not in fact all service providers to varying clients and at varying levels?

Our speakers will cover setting and managing expectations at varying levels of management, the increasing role of Duty of Care as a responsibility for security managers, with travel security as one dominant aspect and the relationship between client and security service provider – what are the current and evolving expectations and contractual obligations? Our discussion panel will address the concept that we are all security providers in the greater scheme of things, whether as a direct supplier, a local security manager or even a corporate CSO.

### **Brian Millen**

***Brian will be speaking on the theme of setting and managing expectations at regional and global levels***

Brian is the GE Senior Regional Security Director, Asia Pacific a position he has held for the last eight years. Prior to taking up this appointment, he served with the Australian military for 30 years, one year as a Consultant at a security information service and three years with ConocoPhillips as their Regional Security Director, Asia Pacific. Brian specializes in crisis management, information security and business risk. Brian has lived in Indonesia for the last 18 years and speaks a number of regional languages.

### **Mark Hayman**

***Mark will address the theme of client / customer expectations from a consultancy perspective.***

Mark heads Arup's Resilience, Security and Risk Consulting Practice in the East Asia Region. Arup's approach to resilience encompasses a holistic approach which articulates security planning as a much broader discipline than is traditional. Key knowledge areas include Threat and Risk Assessment, Risk Management, Security Strategy and Planning, Vulnerability Reviews and Site Audits, CPTED, Operational Planning, and Business Continuity.

Mark has extensive experience in the security field gained from working with high profile clients from a variety of sectors, and from 15 years management and leadership positions in specialized Counter Terrorism, VIP Protection, and Major Event Protection units within the Hong Kong Police.

### **Lane Aldred**

***Lane will speak about the emerging "Duty of Care" regulations, with a focus on implementation and education of staff.***

Lane is the Regional Security Director of Hong Kong for International SOS responsible for security consulting, management and complex problem solutions, primarily in Hong Kong and with notable additional focus on the Philippines and China.

Lane has significant risk management experience after nearly 35 years working in security and risk related fields, including the past 14 years with Control Risks, the world's foremost risk management consultancy. For the past two years, Lane has been an Associate Director with Control Risks' highly successful Crisis and Security Consulting practice in China. The last five years were spent working extensively on developing the business of major Chinese clients seeking to operate in Iraq and Africa as well as overseeing Maritime Security and Crisis Management tasks across the region. Before life in China, Lane worked with Control Risks as a security manager in Africa, Europe and the Middle East serving in a number of operational consultative and management roles.

Prior to joining International SOS Control Risks, Lane served for 12 years with the British Army (Parachute Regiment) including the Falklands war and operational tours of Northern Ireland and Central America and holds a degree in Security and Risk Management from the University of Leicester, UK.
